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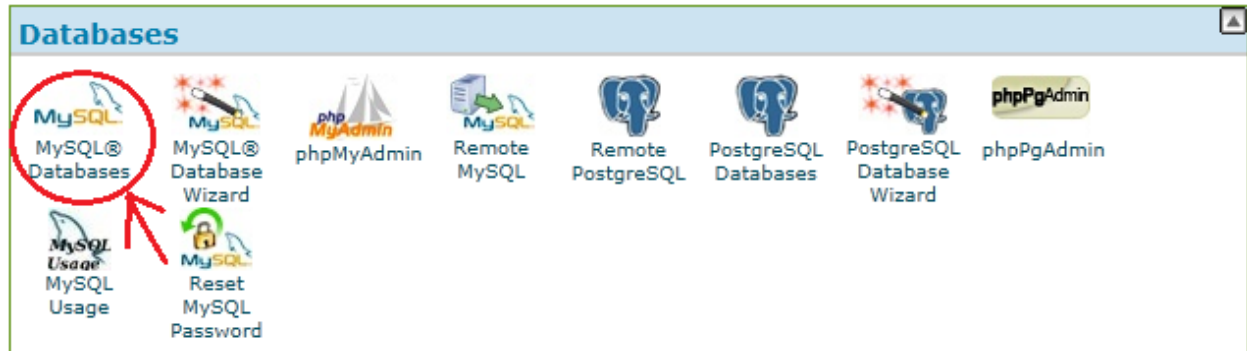
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1. How to upload files into hosting

1.1. Creating a Database

Go to your Cpanel and create a new SQL database.

Click the “MySQL Databases”



Create database, as an example, I will name it “acid”.

Click “Create Database”

Create New Database

New Database:

Now the new database was created: xxxxxxxx_acid

(xxxxxxx is your hosting username)

Now create a new user for this database. I will name the user as “acid”.

Remember also the password - **you will need it later!**

Now the new database and user were created. Let’s assign the rights to the user:



Now we have username: **xxxxxxx_acid**

We also have database name: **xxxxxxx_acid**

And then we have password: **password**

1.2. Editing the files

Open **wp-config.php** with Notepad or Notepad++ which is located inside the archive **default.zip**

Just replace DB name with your **NEW db name**, replace the user with your **NEW username** and also put there your **new password**.

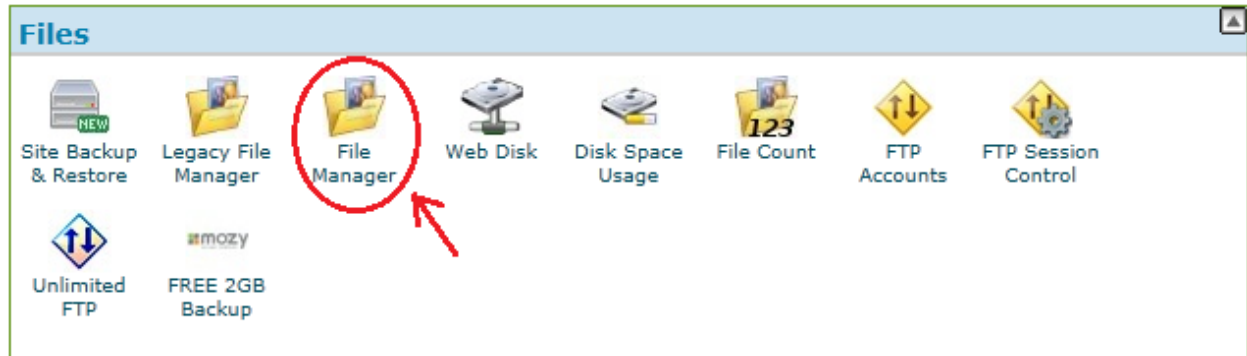

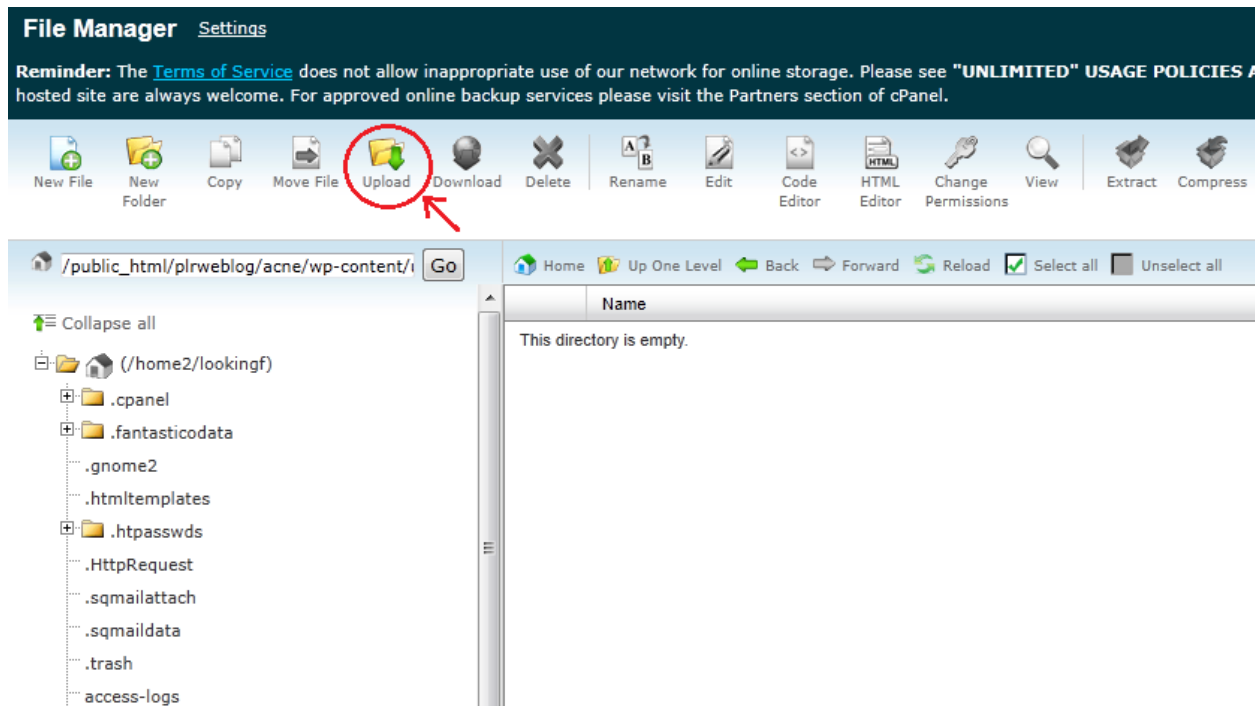
Save the file. Now we are going to upload all files into your hosting.

1.3. Upload files into hosting

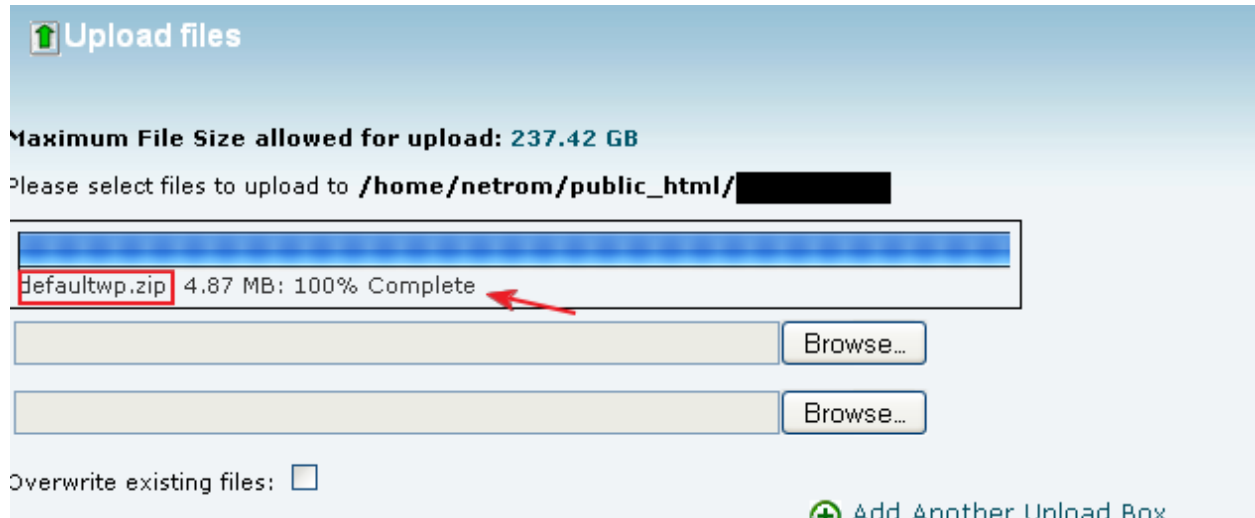
Go to your Cpanel, and select “**File Manager**”. Choose your domain or sub-domain where you want to upload the file.



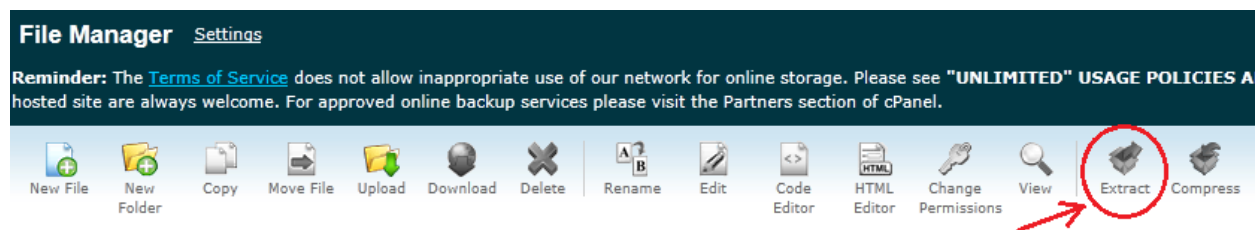
Click “**Upload**” from the top menu.

















A new page will be opened. Click “**Browse**”, and choose the file “**default.zip**”. Uploading process will start automatically.



After the file is successfully uploaded, we need to extract it. Extract button can be found on the top menu.



When it's done, you can see lots of WP files have been extracted.

We do not need the zip file anymore. Select the zip file and click “Delete” from the top menu.

2. Setup phpMyAdmin

Now there is ONE more file to edit. It is the SQL file.

In order for the content to work with your domain, you need to edit the SQL file and REPLACE all instances of the default URL that you can find!

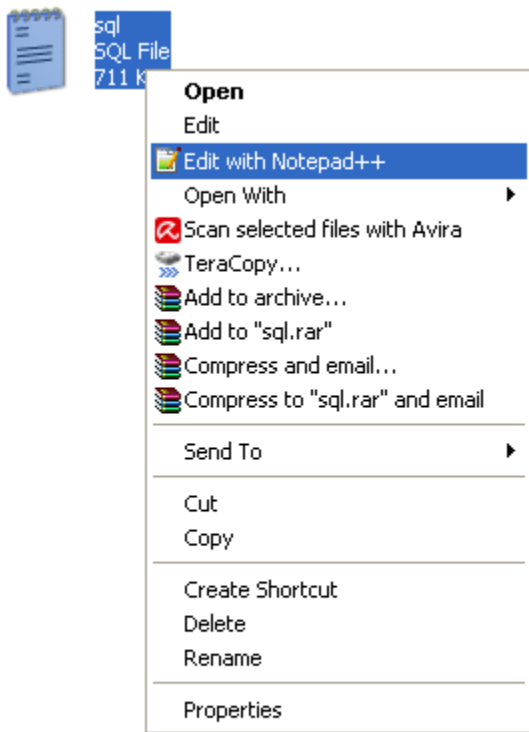
So in this case the original URL is: <http://www.plrwebniche.com/acidreflux>

The URL need to be replaced with yours, e.g. <http://www.yourdomain.com> or <http://www.subdomain.yourdomain.com> or <http://www.yourdomain.com/folder>

You can do this quickly using Notepad++ (download it first if you don't have this, its free)

Follow these steps :

1. Open the SQL file with Notepad++



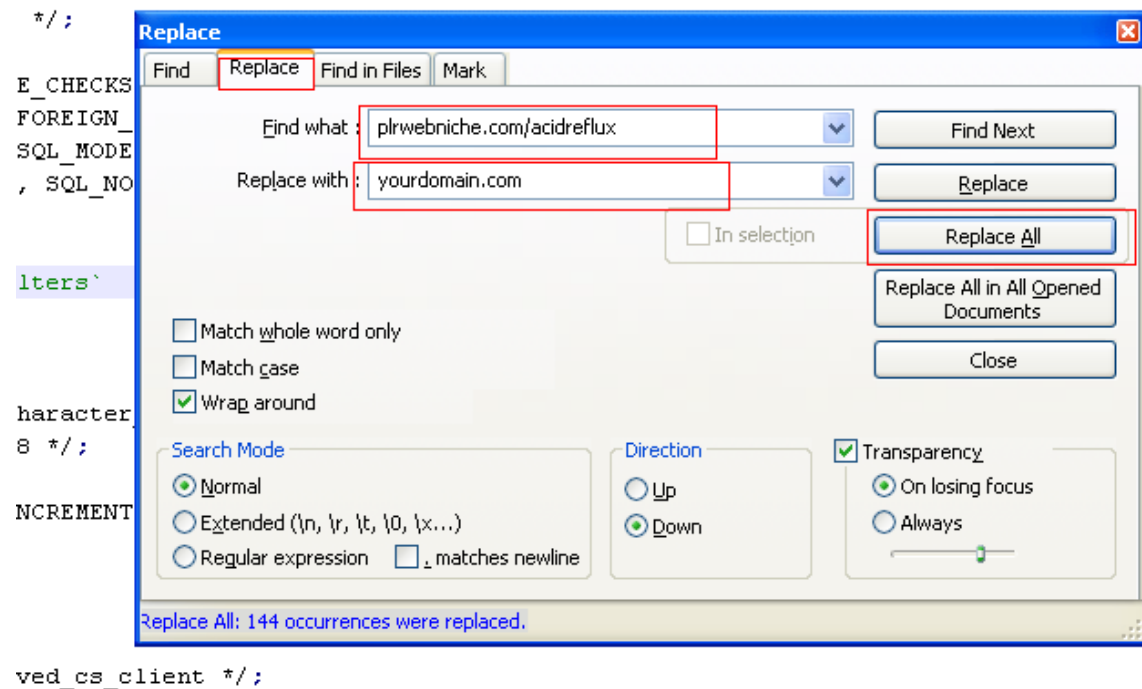
2. Press Control + F on your keyboard. You will see like this.

Click on Replace.

Find what : plrwebniche.com/acidreflux (original URL)

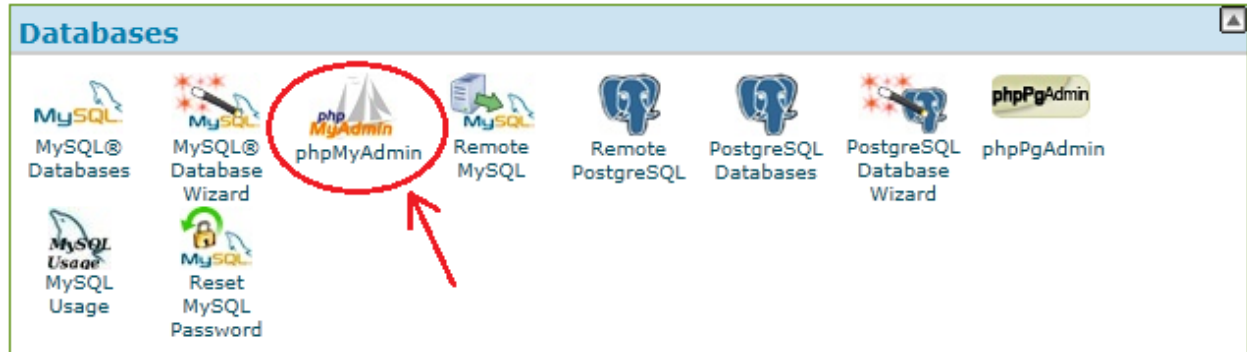
Replace with : yourdomain.com

Then,click Replace All. Close and Save.

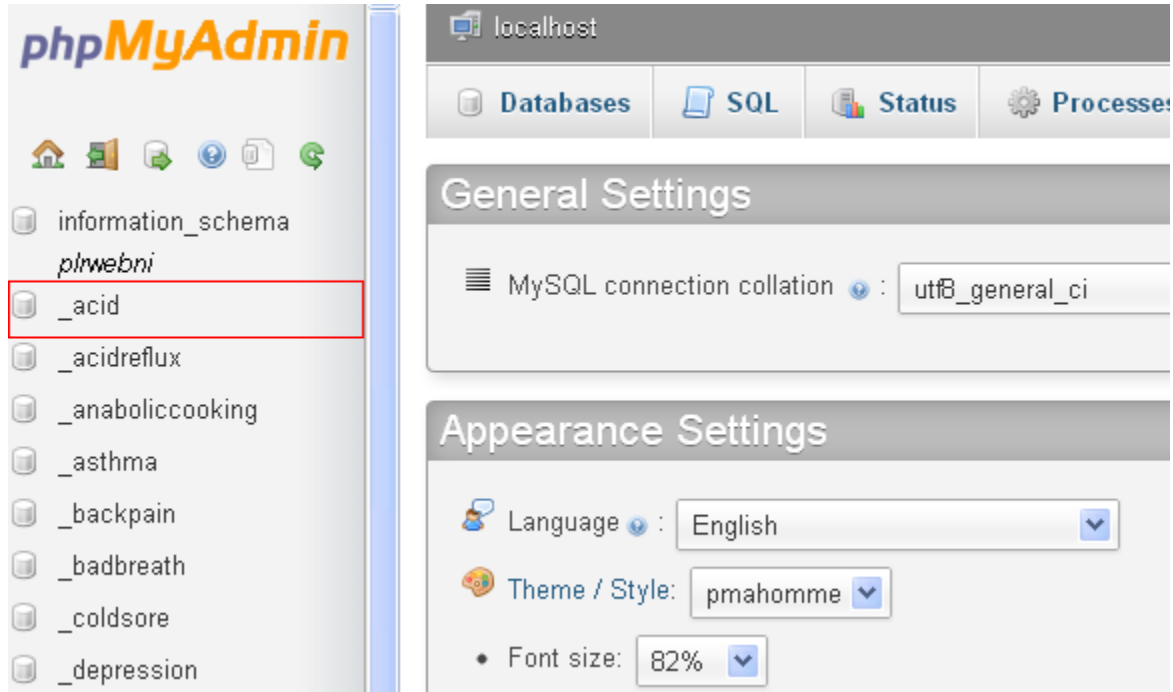

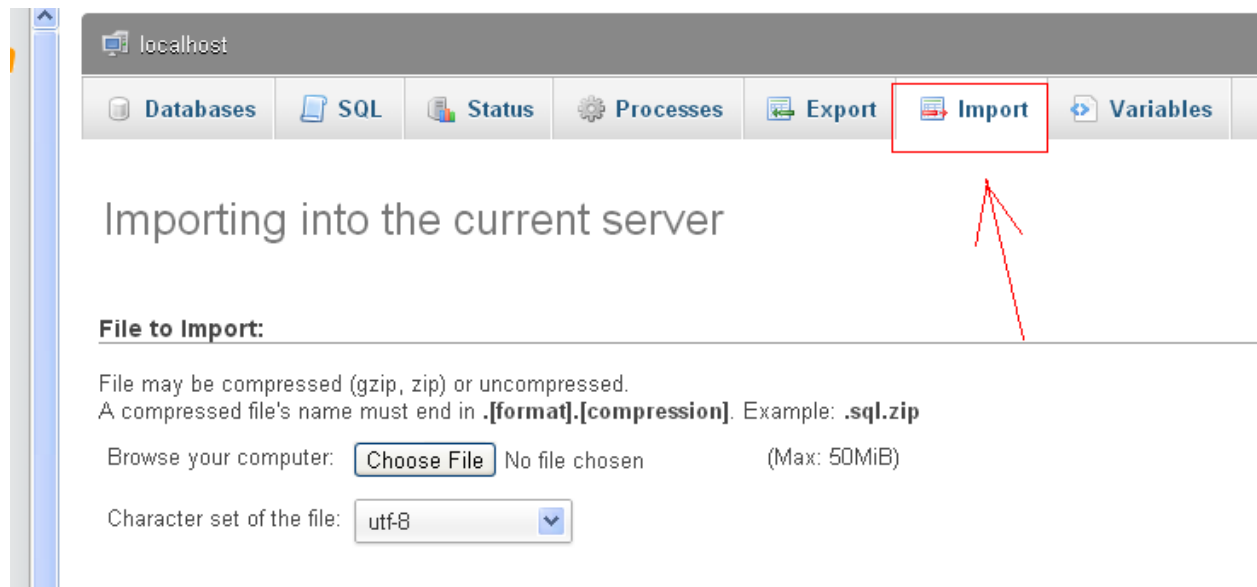
Then, at your Cpanel, click “phpMyAdmin” .



Select your database at the sidebar.



Click “Import” from the top menu.



Click “Browse” and select the edited SQL file.

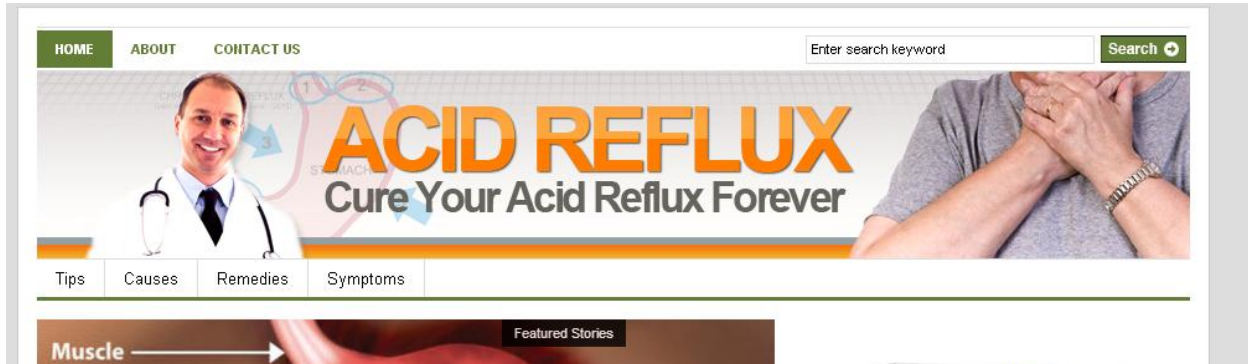

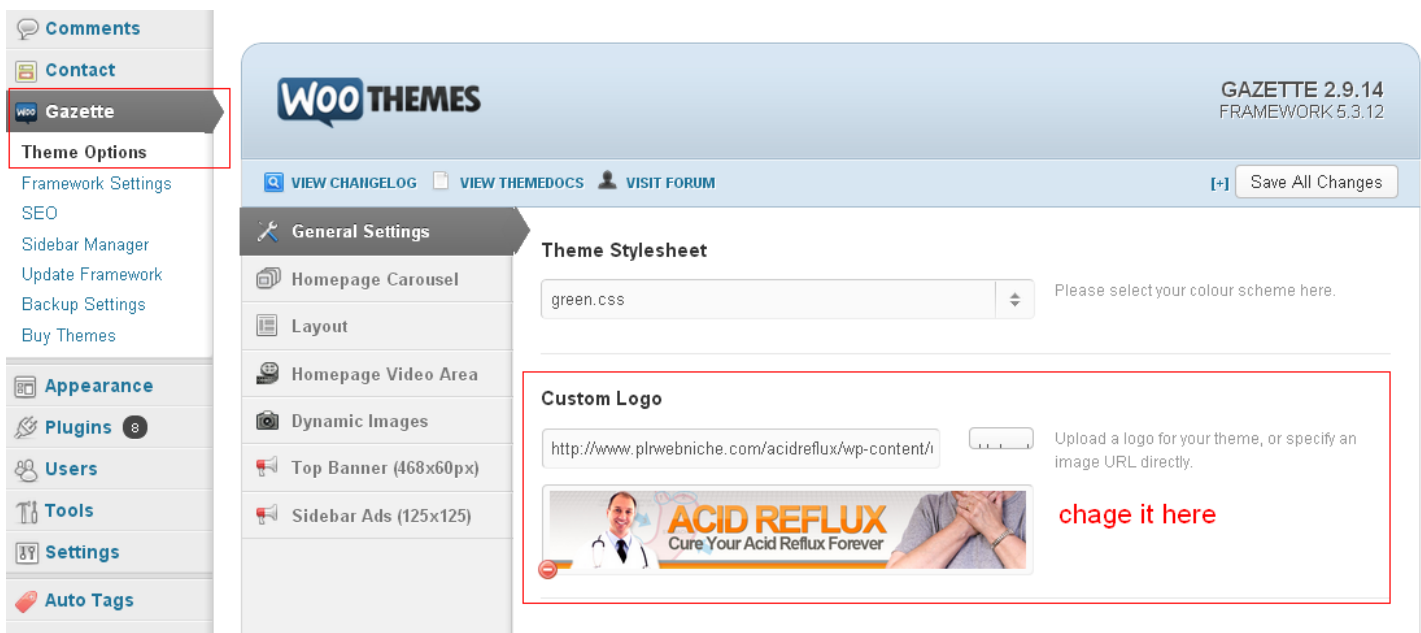

You will get header image with PSD files in this package. If you want to change it to your design, you can follow these steps.



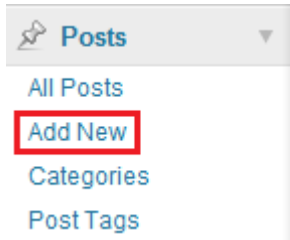
1. Login to your wp-admin
2. Go to Gazette > Theme Options > General Settings > Custom Logo



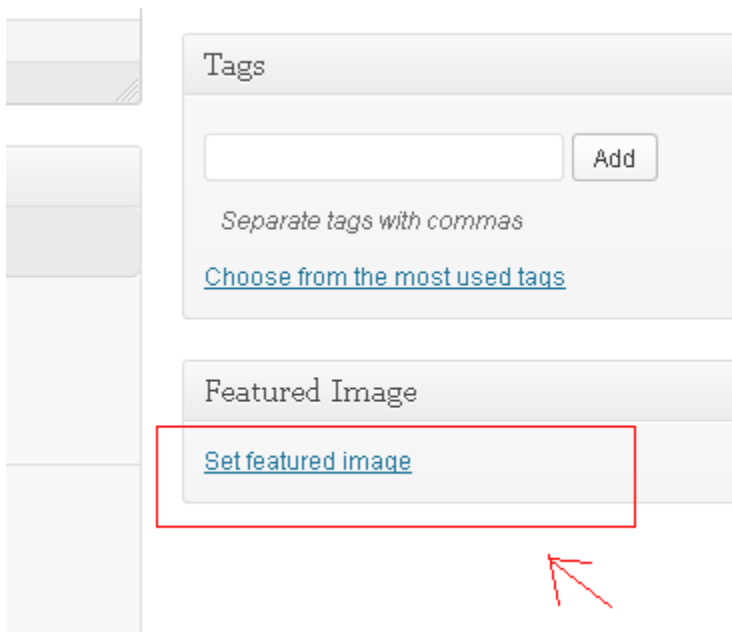
3. You can upload the image directly from your computer or you can paste the image URL in the box given.

4. How To Set A Featured Image or Thumbnail In Posting

Click “New post” from the left hand side of the WP admin dashboard.

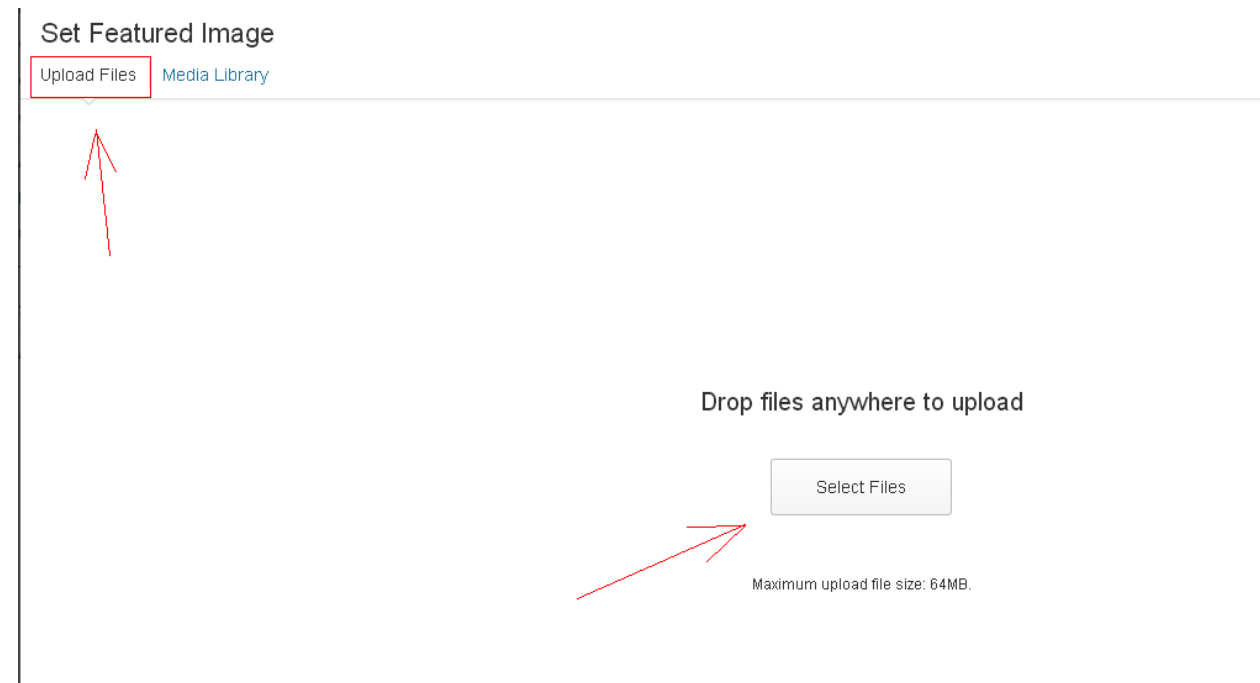


After creating a new post, go to the bottom right of the wp admin dashboard and you will see Set Featured Image :

Click Upload Files > Select Files > Choose Your Image > Set Featured Image > Save

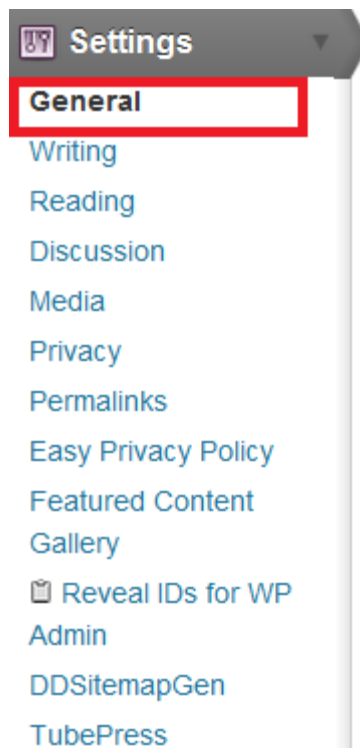

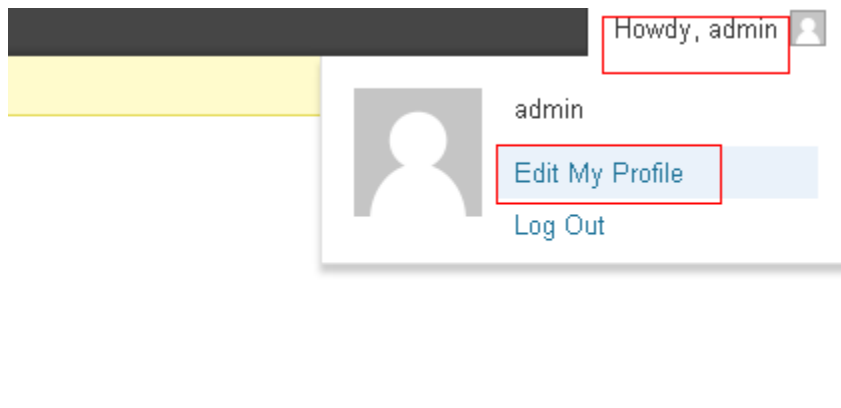
