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# Installing “WPInboxMonster”.

Installing the plugin is like installing any other WP plugin.

**Step 1:** Go to the "Plugins" section and click.

**Step 2:** Click "Add New" and Upload the included zip file.

**Step 3:** Activate "WPInboxMonster".

## Using “WPInboxMonster”.

After activating the plugin, create a New WordPress Page or Post as you usually do.

You'll see the “WPInboxMonster” icon in your editor.



You'll use this button to insert your 2 step optin button on any place of your choice (can be a wordpress page or post).

After clicking the icon, you'll see a window (you'll find a screenshot of it below), from where you can customize your 2 step optin.

Comment: A 2 step optin has two components:

- 1) A Button.
- 2) A Popup (Which contains the autoresponder form).

This window will allow you to easily customize the settings of both components:

## Reference:

1. Style: This will let you select the color of your button / popup.
2. Main Button Text: The text of the button that will open the popup

*Comment: If you want to use an image as your main button (instead of a text button), you can perfectly do it (more details below).*

3. Main Button Position: Left, Right or Center.
  4. Popup Headline: The headline for your popup.
- Popup Button Text: The text that the popup button will show.

*Comment: In two minutes you'll see how to customize other texts (privacy note, placeholders etc).*

The final step is to connect your form with your autoresponder.

If you're using **Aweber** or **GetResponse**, then select it from the **"Autoresponder"** drop down.

Then you have to enter the id of your list. You'll see that the plugin allows you to enter up to 2 lists.

Campaign / List ID:	<input type="text" value="1111"/>
Alternative Campaign / List ID For Free Email Addresses:	<input type="text" value="1112"/>

The first one, will be used with people who enter a commercial email address.

The second one, will be used to subscribe people who entered a free email address (like Gmail, Yahoo etc).

*Comment: If you don't enter an alternative list id, the default one will be used for ALL the subscribers.*

This way you could (for example), subscribe the first group (commercial email addresses) to a single opt-in list, and the second group (free email addresses) to a double opt-in list.

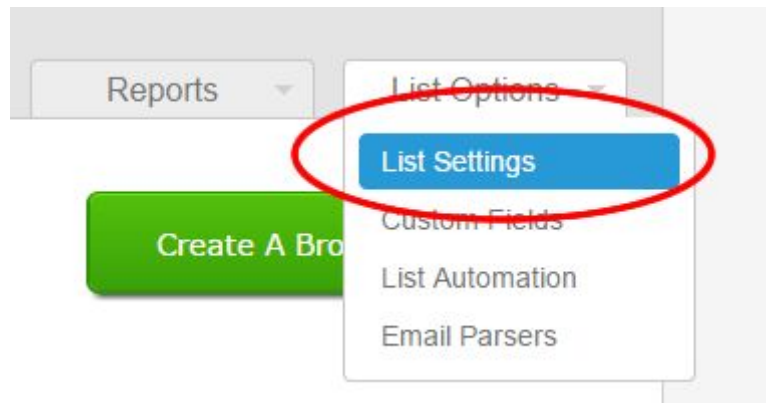
Using Double Opt-In Confirmed Registrations **Can Help You To Get Better Results With Free Email Providers** But Making ALL Your Registrations "Double Opt-In" (From both FREE And Commercial Emails) **Can Make You Miss LOTS of Subscribers** (People Who Forget to Confirm).

By Using the plugin, you can use BOTH models, based on the email address!

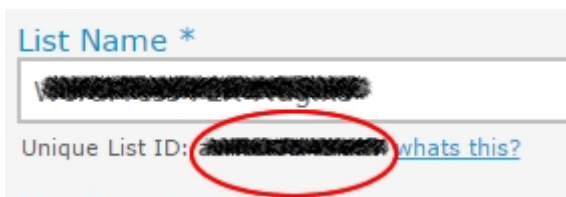
## **How To Find Your List ID In Aweber**

*Step 1: Select one of your lists.*

*Step 2: Go to “List Options” ---> “List Settings”.*

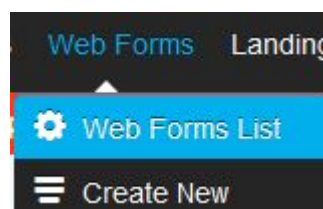


*Step 3: You’ll find your list ID after the “Unique List ID:” label.*



## **How To Find Your List ID In GetResponse**

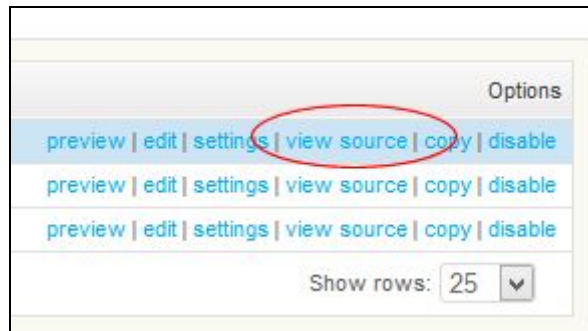
*In getresponse, to get this info you need to go to the “Webforms” section.*



*Basically, if you didn’t create a Webform for one of your lists, you need to create one.*

*After creating a form, you’ll see it under the “Web Forms List”.*

Click the “View Source” for one of your forms:



Then you need to go to the “Publish” tab and you’ll see the ID:



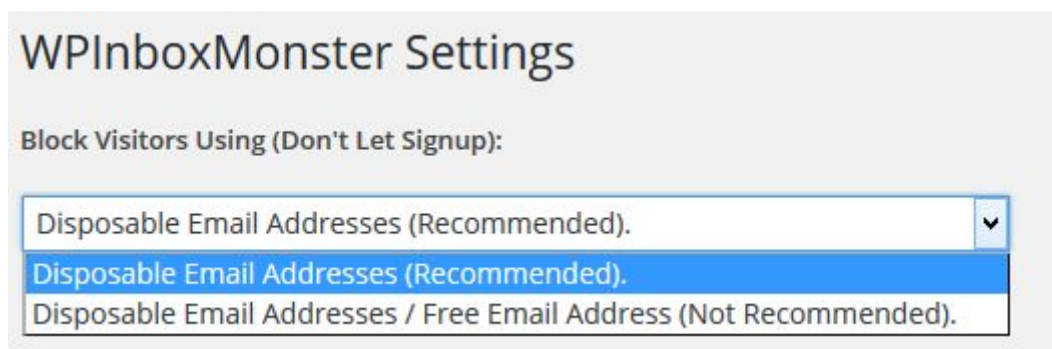
Comment: Here, we’re highlighting it in green (of course, your ID will be different than this one).

### Other Settings

You can adjust more settings from the WPInboxMonster menu under your WP Admin dashboard (left sidebar):




From here you can decide if you allow signups with Free Email Addresses



And you can also customize different text (privacy note, placeholders etc).

You'll also find these 2 text areas...

From here you can edit the list of

- 1) Free Email Providers.
- 2) Disposable Email Providers.

If you want to add more items, make sure to separate them with a | symbol.

*Tip: If you want to not allow signups with 1 email provider in particular (example: Gmail), you could only leave that provider in the "Free Email Providers" box and you could set a custom msg like "Please enter another email provider instead of Gmail".*

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*In the following pages, you'll see how to customize some extra settings (like using images instead of text buttons).*

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# Using Images Instead of Text Buttons

If you want to use an image as your main button (instead of a text button), you can perfectly do it. Just add the **image=""** parameter to your shortcode, including the full path of the image that you want to use as your main button.

For Example:

```
[WPInboxMonster style="green" button1="Download Your Copy"
ar="aweber" campaignid="awlist360XXXX"
image="http://yoursite.com/image.jpg"]
```

You can add it anywhere before the end of the shortcode ( `]`  ), and you don't need to delete or change any other thing.

Tip: WPInboxMonster comes with built in images that you can instantly use

In your 2stepoptin buttons. Just add the parameter **image** to the shortcode (as described before), with the number of the image.

Example: **image="3"**.

Here you can see the images and their numbers.





## Using Aweber?

If you're using aweber, there are 2 extra parameters that you'll surely appreciate:

### 1) Success Url.

You can enter a url to redirect the users right after they've submitted the form (it can be a one time offer etc).

To use a success url, just add the **awsuccessurl** parameter to your shortcode.

Example:

```
[WPInboxMonster style="green" button1="Download Your Copy"
header="Enter Your Details Below" button2="Click to Continue"
ar="aweber" campaignid="awlist360XXXX"
awsuccessurl="http://www.yoursite.com/onetimeoffer.htm"]
```

*Tip: If you're giving a gift to people who subscribe to your list and your list uses double opt-in, you should deliver your gift once the users have confirmed the subscription (go to your aweber list settings page and you'll find an option to enter this url), and not through the **awsuccessurl***

*parameter (which you could use to offer an upsell etc).*

## 2) Already Subscribed Url.

This allows you to show a custom url to those visitors who have been already registered, instead of showing the default Aweber “Already Subscribed” page.

To use this custom url for your “Already Registered” users, you can use the **awalreadyinurl** parameter in your shortcode.

Example:

```
[WPInboxMonster style="green" button1="Download Your Copy"
header="Enter Your Details Below" button2="Click to Continue"
ar="aweber" campaignid="awlist360XXXX"
awsuccessurl="http://www.yoursite.com/onetimeoffer.htm"
awalreadyinurl="http://www.yoursite.com/thanks.htm"]
```

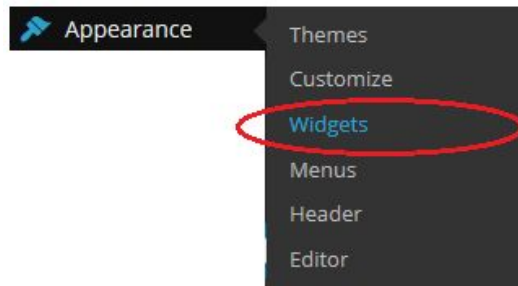
Comments:

1. Both parameters can be used at the same time.
2. This is for Aweber users only. If you’re using Getresponse, these settings can be controlled from your GR dashboard.

## “WPInboxMonster” Can Be Added To a Widget .

If your theme supports widgets, you can do the payment switch by adding the “WPInboxMonster” widget to it.

You’ll find the “WPInboxMonster” widget here...



Locate the “WPInboxMonster” widget and paste the shortcode buttons that you’ve added to another post or page, inside your widget.

Save it and you can now add the widget to your theme.
