Action takers also “learn” what they are selling by actually using the software so they can support their customers. So if you plan on selling, at least learn a little about the product. It will improve your reputation and also reduce possible refunds...

Getting Starting Using Flip'in List Builder

The simplest way to learn how to use this software is:

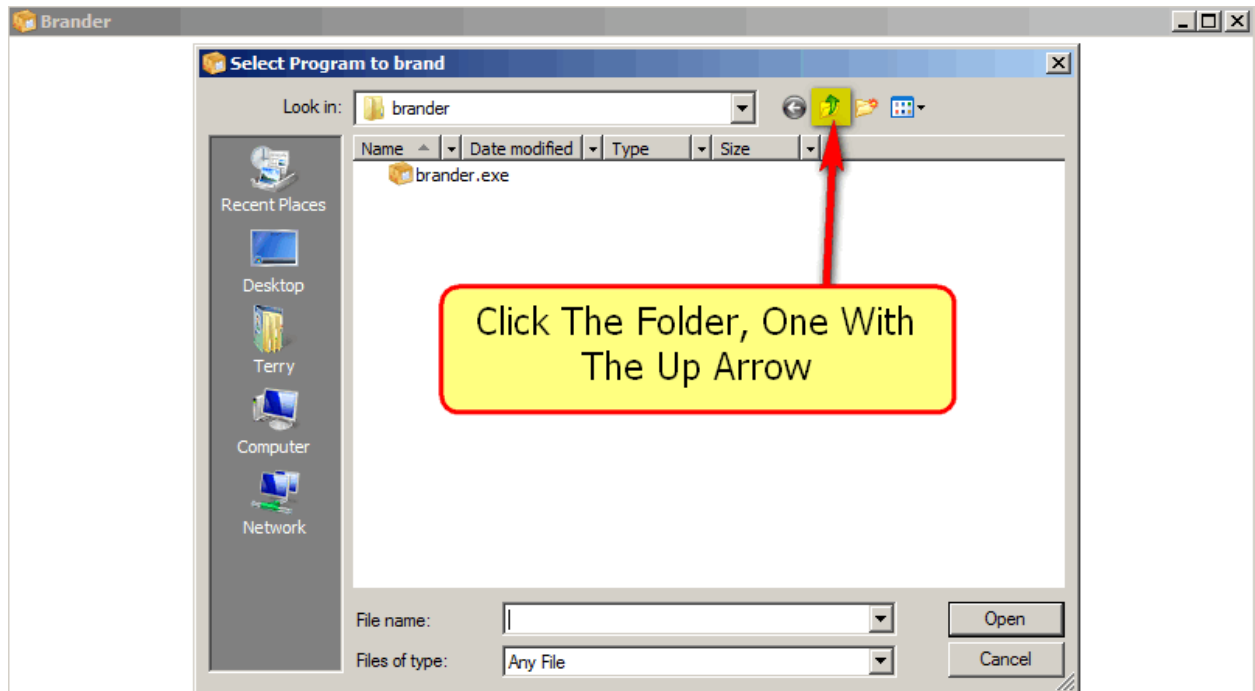
- 1) Load up the example flipbook from the "Example Project / Ready Flipbook" folder. Take a close look at it.
- 2) Start the software up from the "Software" folder. Double click on the "Flipin List Builder.exe" file.
- 3) Load the sample project file which is the same flipbook from step 1. With software open, go to "File / Open" and load project file in "Example Project" folder called "dream-job.jet".
- 4) Look at the ready made flipbook example while navigating the software. It should become clear as air if you will compare the two.

Rebranding The Flip'in Software

The software includes a "brander" which allows you to personalize the help, about and link shown between the "next and previous" buttons.

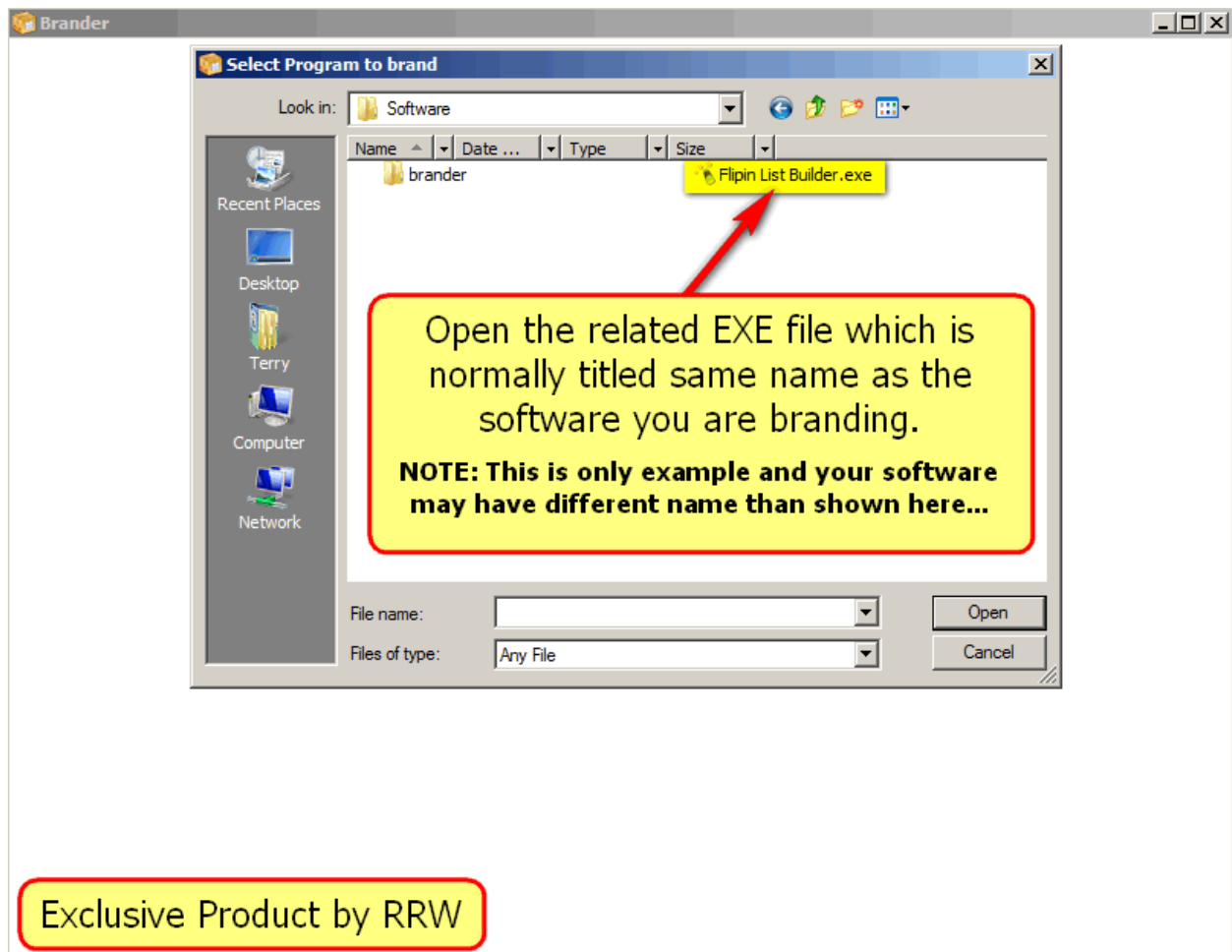
It is very simple and does not need much explanation.

- 1) Open folder of main software and locate the folder within called "brander". Open the exe file titled "brander.exe".
- 2) After opening brander software you will see:

3) Then after clicking the folder with up arrow you will:

Callout Box 1: Create a Reg Code of your choice and enter URL to opt-in form. Send code to new subscriber AFTER they confirm their email...

Callout Box 2: If you decide to choose "Reg Code" keep in mind it is NOT to protect the software. The real purpose is "list building".

Simple as can be and you can rebrand the software as many times as you please with different names. Same goes for the “Reg Code”. Use different reg codes and opt-in forms to build laser targeted lists!

Note about the background image: Since many of your smart marketers will be renaming the software, you will also want to replace the background image. Most all of the software includes either a blank JPG an/or the PSD file. Ideal image size is 640px X 480px and MUST be in JPG format.

Creating Windows Installer Package

As you may have noticed there are other files in folder along with the EXE file. This can be confusing to “Windows Rookies”. Once you reband the software recommend you make your own installer.

Fortunately there many free methods to solve this issue and make your software more user friendly. I use “Inno Setup” for three reasons: free, simple to use and will create a link of YOUR choice in the users start menu.
